

# **Manchester-by-the-Sea**

**POPULATION** AGE

Manchester-by-the-Sea's population was 5,136 at the time of the 2010 Census. It has increased to 5,808 according to a 2014 Town Census.



Manchester-by-the-Sea's population is older than that of the state and Essex County. About 20% of residents are 65 and older, compared to 14% of residents in the state and the county.





#### REVENUE AND EXPENDITURES
